

Discover your own way to enjoy Takarazuka at "Sightseeing Promenade".

Takarazuka Grand Theater, The Osamu Tezuka Manga Museum, hot springs, outdoor sculptures, the scenery reflected on the surface of the Mukogawa River, the ridgelines of the mountains... Please enjoy it in your own way.

Takarazuka Grand Theater 〈宝塚大劇場〉

Since opening in 1924 (Taisho 13) as a dedicated theatre for the Takarazuka Revue, it has continued to attract many people. In addition to a grand staircase, a silver bridge, a luxurious stage with an orchestra box, and a large atrium lobby, there are also Revue shops and restaurants. You can enjoy the charm of Takarazuka.



Takarazuka Revue Hall of Fame 〈宝塚歌劇の殿堂〉

Established within the Takarazuka Grand Theater in April 2014, commemorating the 100th anniversary of the Takarazuka Revue. It showcases the achievements of graduates and staff who contributed to the development of the Takarazuka Revue, including artifacts with connections to their journeys. In the current Takarazuka Revue Zone, you can get up close to costumes and props used in performances.



🙋 Osamu Tezuka Manga Museum 〈宝塚市立手塚治虫記念館〉 ………



This is a memorial museum to Osamu Tezuka, known for manga such as "Astro Boy" and "Black Jack." Takarazuka is where he lived from the age of 5 to 24. You can enjoy Tezuka World to the fullest, including the "Library." which has most of Tezuka's manga works, "Atom Vision." which screens original video works, and an anime production workshop.

Takarazuka Bunkasozokan (Former home of the Takarazuka Music School) 〈宝塚文化創造館(宝塚音楽学校旧校舎)〉

The building was constructed in 1935 in Modernist style and served as a part of Takarazuka Music School until March 1998, producing many Takarazuka

performers. Today, it's renovated and utilized as a cultural facility by the city. Elements from its music school days, such as stair treads, remain, preserving the ambiance of that era. On the second floor, you can explore exhibitions related to the Takarazuka Music School and the Takarazuka Revue with accompanying visuals at the "Sumire & Museum."



◆ Takarazuka Arts Center 〈宝塚市立文化芸術センター〉

A multifaceted facility designed to foster a broad appreciation of culture and the arts. It comprises a centre Area for cultural and artistic pursuits and a Garden Area for communing with nature. Featuring a Main Gallery for various exhibitions and an Atelier for creative experiences, it's a casual environment to enjoy art and nature while nurturing creativity.



⑤ Hana no Michi 〈花のみち〉 ·······

This road, famous for its beautiful cherry blossoms in spring, welcomes people heading to the Takarazuka Grand Theater with its changing scenery throughout the seasons. The sidewalks are adorned with bronze statues, including "The Rose of Versailles" and the statue of Mr. Ichizo



Nestled in the heart of Takarazuka City, this urban oasis allows you to enjoy the lush natural beauty of the Mukogawa River and surrounding mountains. With a history dating back to the Kamakura period, nearly 800 years ago, this hot spring is renowned for its salt mineral springs containing carbon dioxide and iron, believed to provide relief for conditions like neuralgia and muscle pain. (Available at Hotel Wakamizu, Washington Hotel, and Natur Spa Takarazuka.)




This spa resort, designed by architect Tadao Ando, is a day-trip hot spring facility. Alongside the Takarazuka hot springs, it features a fitness gym and offers beauty treatments, and even bedrock baths.

图 Horai Bridge 〈宝来橋(S字橋)〉

An S-shaped bridge designed by French sculptor Marta Pan. The bridge features planting zones and seamlessly blends into the flow of the Mukogawa River and the surrounding mountains, making it ideal for a leisurely stroll.
